# Message from Pastor Brandon

In Matthew 6:5-14 and Luke 11:1-4 is recorded an interaction between Jesus and His disciples in which He is teaching them about prayer. It's an account sometime referred to as the "model prayer". This is an accurate title for this part of scripture because it is an accurate description of what's found there. Jesus is giving the disciples a model by which they can learn to pray in light of and in line with His kingdom. As I read it this morning, it reminded me that Jesus has modeled prayer for us in at least two ways. For one, He expresses this model with His lips. But He also exemplified prayer for us by modeling it in His life. For example, throughout the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) we see it said that "Jesus went away by Himself to pray" (Matt. 14:1-13, MK. 6:30-32, LK. 4:1-2, 14-15). Through this, we see our need for prayer. If Jesus, the very Son of God, was in need of regular communion with the Father through prayer then how much more are we?

Besides our need for prayer, we learn much about the nature of prayer from Jesus. The model prayer as it is recorded in Matt. 6 teaches us how we shouldn't pray. The model prayer as it's recorded in Lk. 11 teaches us how we should pray. These are two different recorded accounts of the same prayer which, taken together, are tremendously helpful to us as we grow in the gift of prayer. Also, Jesus gives us a number of parables which teach vitally important truths like diligence in prayer, the impact of prayer, the heart of the Father to answer prayer and so on. It's important to remember when we consider the model prayer that Jesus was not giving the disciples a legalistic formula. Rather, He was giving them loving guidance by which they could pray in line with the heart of the Father.

Whatever you do, do it from the heart, as something done for the Lord and not for people.

Colossians 3:23

Prayer is an important part of our journey with Jesus, based on relationship. It is not an imposition to be endured based on rules. This is part of why, when we learn to use the Word of God as a guide for prayer, we can gain fresh, inspired, insight for prayer each new day.

The more we grow to understand the need for prayer and the nature of prayer, the more we grow to understand our need for the Pray-er. Why did the disciples ask Jesus in Luke 11:1 to "Teach us to pray"? It is because they knew He was the master Pray-er. Jesus lived His life on earth in constant communion with the Father. Now, as He is seated at the right hand of the Father in heaven. He is continually interceding for us, His followers, in prayer (Rom. 8:34). Even when we don't know how we ought to pray the Holy Spirit intercedes on our behalf, before the Father, "with groanings too deep for words." (Rom. 8:26) Christian, keep leaning on your need for prayer. Keep learning about the nature of prayer (we'll be learning about the things of God throughout eternity, and that's a good thing!) Keep looking to the master Pray-er. Even when we don't know what we ought to pray, He does, and He is interceding for us.
